

A note from our principal Ms. Nelson:

Greetings Rocky River High School Community:

It is hard to believe that spring is already here. The springtime brings warm weather, spring sports, visual and performing arts performances, as well as the wrapping up of another great academic year!

Our focus areas over the next few months are grounded in our student's academics and attendance. All of our students must be at school every day, ready to learn. It is a core component of our work to ensure the best academic outcomes for every child, every day, for a better tomorrow.

Our teachers are working extremely hard to challenge the academic outcomes of our students, providing rigorous instruction. Our students are:

- participating in high-level class discussions based on what they have read in different texts,
- focusing on the process they used to get to an answer, not just the actual answer,
- creating assignments that are applicable to different audiences and have a real purpose,
- learning about how to create an argument (using logic and reasoning to explain their thoughts and ideas), and
- reading more and more complicated text.

This work is critically important if we are to prepare our students for their future college and/or career goals. Regardless of what they do after they graduate from high school, they need to have the skills to do these tasks extremely well.

The attendance of our students is necessary if our teachers and students are supposed to engage in this type of learning. Our students rarely fail due to academics. They fail due to attendance. We encourage all our students who are at risk of failure due to attendance to ensure they are making up this time with their teacher or during Saturday Attendance Recovery at Rocky River High School.

There are several resources available to our families to help our students become successful. Please see our website for more information about these programs.

A note from our principal Ms. Nelson continued...

As we started this academic year, we set goals for our school improvement. In my earlier letters throughout the year, I reminded the community of our school improvement goals:

- To <u>increase graduation rate</u> by 2.1% from 88.9% in 2013-2014 to 91% in 2014-2015.
- To increase promotion rate in 9th grade by 3.2% from 86.8% in 2013-2014 to 90% in 2014-2015.
- To <u>increase promotion rate in 10th grade</u> by 4.4% from 85.6% in 2013-2014 to 90% in 2014-2015.
- To <u>increase the promotion rate in 11th grade</u> by 1.5% from 95.5% in 2013-2014 to 97% in 2014-2015.

To <u>increase our overall school proficiency</u> on the Math 1, English II and Biology EOCs from 34.11% in 2013-2014 to 42.5% in 2014-2015.

Our school's success thus far gives me confidence to believe that we will achieve these goals. We are definitely on our way.

My hope and expectation is that you will continue to partner Rocky River High School to achieve these goals. We are all continuing to grow and learn together, and I look forward to all the collaborative work we will do together. 

PRESIDENT

Responsibilities:

- a. Conduct all PTSA Executive and General Board meetings.
- b. Confer with the Principal prior to all meetings.
- c. Prepare agenda prior to meetings.
- d. Work with teachers to assess their needs.
- e. Attend district meetings, as necessary.
- f. Create upcoming school year calendar with Principal and Board members.
- g. Coordinate elections of Board members.
- h. Coordinate summer budget meeting.
- i. In August, hire/find professional to perform an examination of PTSA financial records; and said professional to prepare a written summary [letter] for presentation to the Board.

VICE PRESIDENT

Responsibilities:

- a. Conduct PTSA Executive and General Board meetings in the absence of the PTSA President.
- b. Assist the President with duties as needed.
- c. Take and distribute meeting minutes when the Secretary is absent.
- d. Organize childcare for the PTSA meetings when necessary.
- e. Be timekeeper at the PTSA General Membership meetings.

SECRETARY

Responsibilities:

- a. Record minutes of the Executive Board meeting and distribute to Board members.
- b. Record minutes of the General Membership meeting and distribute to Board members.
- c. Make meeting minutes available for the Rocky River website.

TREASURER

Responsibilities:

- a. Responsible for checking/savings account. Receive and deposit all money.
- b. Pay out funds in accordance with the approved budget or as authorized by the Executive Board.
- c. Prepare, along with the Executive Board, the yearly budget for the new school year.
- d. Present financial report to the Executive Board and General Membership meetings for approval.
- e. Keep an accurate record of receipts and expenditures.
- f. Prepare year-end financial statements for audit.
